What is an Environmental **Impact Assessment and** what were the results?

An Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) considers the impact of the scheme on the environment and proposes appropriate mitigation. It focuses on wildlife and biodiversity, air quality, noise and vibration, landscape and cultural heritage, transportation, water environment, land quality and contamination, and people.





Will GFPS destroy natural habitats for birds, fish, and aquatic life?

Protecting the natural environment and waterways during the construction of the flood defences is of the utmost importance to Falkirk Council and the wider project team. We have undertaken an Environmental Impact Assessment and will be proposing ways of mitigating the potential impact. We are working with key stakeholders such as SEPA, the Marine Directorate and NatureScot to ensure we are compliant with statutory requirements.
